7 out of 7 Year 12 completers from this school responded to the 2020 survey.


Post-school pathways

No respondents were participating in post-school education or training.


Work was a pathway for one respondent who was doing unpaid or volunteer work.

The post-school pathways of Year 12 completers from special schools were categorised into eight *main pathways*. Respondents who were in education, training or employment as well as attending a day service were reported in their education, training or employment pathways. ducation and Training	
Campus-based study ^{a b}	Studying at Certificate I, II, III, IV, Diploma, Advanced Diploma, Associate Degree or Bachelor Degree level (excluding apprentices and trainees).
Apprenticeship or Traineeship ^b	Employment-based apprenticeship or traineeship.
Employment	
Open employment ^b	Undertaking full or part-time work in a non-supported employment environment and not in an education or training category.
Supported employment ^b	Undertaking full or part-time work in a supported employment environment and not in an education or training category.
Unpaid or volunteer work ^b	Undertaking unpaid work—including vocational placements, internships, work experience and trials—or volunteer work.
Attending day service	
Attending day service	Attending a day service one or more days per week and not in an education, training or employment category.
Not in a meaningful pathway	
Seeking work	Looking for work and not in education, training, employment or day service.
NILFET	Not in education, training, employment, day service or seeking work.
